- Woolly Bugger (Olive) size 8
- Scuds (Brown, Gray or Olive) Sizes 12 – 20
- Woolly Worm Size 2 -10
- San Juan Worm* Size 10 - 12

Nymphs

- Golden Ribbed Hair's Ear Sizes 12 – 16
- Pheasant Tail* Sizes 12 – 20
- Dark Stone Fly Size 10 3X Long
- Red Fox Squirrel Sizes 14 – 16
- Copper John* (Copper or Red) Sizes 12 – 16
- C-R Gold* Sizes 8 – 12
- Zug Bug* Sizes 12 -16
